FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

I usually like to write about more inspirational matters here. It is a great way to evangelize. But I wanted to inform everyone this week about the recent work being completed in the back schoolyard. It came to our attention during the second week of the year that the steam pipe that connects the old wing to the new wing of the school was leaking back into the boiler room of the school proper. An attempt was made to patch the holes in the pipe but it was unsuccessful. Work was begun on Thursday the 22nd to replace the steam, return and water pipes that connect the two wings. It has been a substantial project. Substantial in that it has effected the school, religious ed and morning Mass community in addition to the Sisters and myself, but substantial, also, in that it will cost approximately \$60,000.00 once all is said and done.

This was not a planned project nor was it a frivolous one: people and pipes need heat in the winter months. It's as simple as that. As the work is coming to completion the second phase of the project begins—paying for it. It would be great if someone would walk up and hand me a check for the cost. But I find that unlikely. Perhaps sixty families will give a thousand dollars each? Maybe six hundred people will give a hundred dollars a piece? All of those would be great. What I do know is that the parish cannot adequately cover this unforeseen expense alone. I need everyone's help.

I am asking everyone in the parish to simply put a donation in a plain white envelope marked "**Pipes**" and place it in the basket in the coming weeks. It can be ten thousand, a thousand or a hundred or fifty dollars. What is important is that everyone help out. Extraordinary events call for extraordinary responses. I know the people of Incarnation are up to the challenge. I have already begun the collection by writing out a \$500. check of my own.

While the pipes gave out this month, I am so happy to say that Incarnation School is a thriving community with 315 children coming to our doors to be educated each morning. They leave each day nurtured intellectually, emotionally and spiritually. And they have the marks and placements in high school that demonstrate how a community of children, parents and faculty can make an impact in not only a family but in a larger community as well.

That's why I ask your help with the pipe replacement. So the kids can continue to learn week after week and the Gospel can continue to be preached Sunday after Sunday.
