FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

A few years back, a woman yelled at me for participating in Halloween Festivities. Then was not the time to explain to her Halloween has much of its roots in the Church. *Halloween* comes from *All Hallows' Eve*: the day before All Saints' Day. Our costume wearing came from people, particularly children, who dressed up like the Saints as part of the Holy Day's festivities. It was a great celebration of the Church—nothing ghoulish about it. Through the years, though, the presence of All Souls' Day made its way into the sanctoral festivities and the trappings of the faithful departed—death, souls or spirits, and cemeteries—give us much of our Halloween customs of today.

So many years later, my response to the woman who yelled at me is not to do away with *Halloween* but ensure everyone realizes it's really *All Hallows' Eve*. Christmas is about commemorating Christ's birth but I have nothing against "Rudolph" and "Frosty" as long as Christ is central. This is the week to talk about the Saints in our homes. Talk about the Saints' festivities of October 31 and November 1. But also discuss the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed on November 2. The discussions, however, should not end there. Recount the lives of favorite or patron Saints—costumes are optional! Recall recent future Saints like Blessed Teresa of Calcutta or the Servant of God, John Paul the Great. Even better would be the rediscovery of how we can become Saints. The holy ones of today are the Saints of the future.

On November 10, over thirty of our young people will present themselves to Bishop DiMarzio and ask for the Gift of the Holy Spirit at Confirmation. In doing so they will attempt to model their lives on the Saints who have preceded them whose names they have taken commemorating their Confirmation.

Who's your Confirmation Saint? Your patron? Our guide in the Holy Land was named "Mary." She was named that because she was born on Mary's birthday, Sept 8. The Saints are there to guide & support us on our journey.

In one sense the present-day Halloween Celebrations are a classic misdirect: by focusing on ghosts, ghouls and ax murderers we take our eyes off the Saints. In truth that is the most frightening aspect of Halloween. We are missing a great opportunity to look to, and reflect on, the Saints. While the candy is great, believe me, I eat enough of it— even better are the treats of kindness that can be performed in imitation of the Saints.

So Happy All Hallows' Eve, Everyone!

And don't forget about All Saints' and All Souls' Day!
