FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

Other than wanting to be a fireman, an astronaut, a baseball player and a superhero all before I reached fifth grade, I can honestly say that I always wanted to be a priest. That desire began in earnest in May 1977 when I became an Altar Server at Holy Innocents Parish in Flatbush Brooklyn. From serving Mass I was able to see the lives and ministries of the parish priests. As I grew older I began to help out in the sacristy and then the rectory office. When I was a sophomore at Cathedral Prep I became the moderator of the Servers at Holy Innocents.

My vocation was not just encouraged through serving. So many people prayed for me or remarked to me that I would be a good priest when I grew older. I was encouraged through my family and our neighborhood. I know that my grandmother, grand aunt and aunts had a special roll, too. As I grew older and entered Cathedral Prep and later the seminary I was inspired by holy priests and began to be encouraged by my peers with whom I went to grade school.

As great as it would be if vocations to the priesthood fell out of the sky, they don't. (Then again I don't think you would want me landing on you from 80 or 90 thousand feet!) Vocations come from families: your immediate family and the parish family! Priests are your grandsons, sons, brothers and nephews. They sit next to you in class and sometimes run over your lawn. They serve Mass as kids or decide that God wants them to do something else when they leave their \$106,000 a year job. Perhaps they were in the armed forces or at one time were seriously thinking about marriage. Whoever they are— one thing is certain: they are in your midst.

I always find it strange when very devout people pray for vocations to the priesthood but never think to pray for their sons or family. "I want to have grandchildren." "I want him to be successful; to make a lot of money. I want him to be happy" they say. But what does God want? We believe that a vocation is precisely that: a calling from God. If God is calling shouldn't we help people hear? Isn't that part of being a Christian to point others to the Christ?

For the most part, I work hard. I sleep well. I have good days and bad days. But I am extremely happy being a priest 17 years and being your pastor for 10 months. Moreover I feel that I have tried to do what the Lord has called me to do.

As we welcome our new servers this weekend, maybe in 15 years or so we might be going to a priestly ordination. I can't say for certain. But I can assure you it won't happen without our prayers and support!
