FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

I like my car. It's a black Buick that has treated me well so far. It's comfortable and it gets me where I want to go. If need be I can change a tire and the wiper fluid. And of course I can start it. Without exaggeration that is all I know about cars. Even though I am clueless about cars that does not keep me from enjoying them or interacting with them. I am ignorant of most aspects of the automobile but that doesn't mean I can't drive. I think you get the picture. You might even be in the same boat - ah, well, car- as me.

As we celebrate the Holy Trinity in a special way this weekend I think of how the Mystery of the Holy Trinity is so beyond my human understanding. I really am so clueless about the splendor, majesty and wonder of God. But that ignorance does not exclude me from relating to and participating in the Triune Mystery. In fact the immensity of the Mystery draws me closer to wonder at and try to figure out not just the Three Persons of the One God but how I can live as a member of an earthly community or Church where we are very much distinct and individual (like the Persons of the Trinity) and yet united as members of the One Body of Christ (like the Oneness of God).

A smooth car ride in the hills of the countryside during foliage season is both relaxing and inspiring and yet I never really think about traction, horse power or even how the car radio and speakers work. I am more focused on the rolling colors of autumn at every twist and turn before me. In a similar fashion I can live my life focused on so many beautiful and astounding people and events around me that I fail to realize how the presence of the Triune God effects my perspective on life.

Many times people speak about love or God's Love as if they have a understanding of what that means. Yet we only have a human perspective of Divine Love. To the best of our ability we participate in that love. It is interesting that you rarely hear people talking about the Unity of God. Yet that Unity cannot be separated from that Love. Perhaps Divine Love is fused with Divine Unity. Maybe the challenge for us this Trinity Sunday is to work towards greater unity. If we see ourselves as more joined or interconnected with others I know it would be easier to love them and that love would be to a greater degree. Isn't that how it works with our families? Part of our love for each family member is that she or he shares my blood.

As Catholic Christians everything we do begins and ends: "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." But that just scratches the surface of a Mystery that is filled with Love and Unity: a Mystery that is at the heart of God and his Church. Even if we are clueless about the magnitude of the Triune Mystery does not mean we can't appreciate it and work towards the very Love and Unity that moves the stars and planets and hearts of all the created.
