**FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN**

Every year I get questioned about what I am doing for Lent. So I figured I'd ask you "what are you doing for Easter?" I was going to eat all those treats I gave up during Lent for the next fifty days but my cardiologist yelled at me. But seriously what are some things that you, I and every other Christian can do to remind us and others that the Lord is truly Risen. How can we make these days of Easter Joy more profound and tangible in our lives and in the lives of others? For over the past two years we have had the opportunity to watch our Holy Father and the joy that he has brought to the papacy. I am pretty confident that he has been filled with that joy well before he was elected to sit in St. Peter's Chair. I'm pretty sure that his joy is present throughout the entire year. So are we filled with Easter Joy?

Another page from the Pope's "Easter Prayer Book" is "Mercy." He and his actions have come to be synonymous with mercy. Today, this Divine Mercy Sunday, he officially promulgates the Jubilee Year of Mercy to begin this December 8. I hope that even in our neck of the woods the richness of God's mercy will be rediscovered in our homes and in our Church Community. I hope that you will consider joining us for our "Mercy Celebration" beginning at 3PM today in the church. We will have adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet, sung Evening Prayer and Benediction as we conclude the Easter Octave.

To share Easter Joy and God's Mercy while we bring the Gospel accounts of the Lord's Resurrection to others seems to me like a pretty sound plan this Easter Season. I would also recommend keeping up your Easter décor until Memorial Day when the Easter Season concludes.

I bet you already noticed in church that in addition to the Easter Candle this year a statue of the Resurrected Lord has replaced the Cross over the Tabernacle in the center of the sanctuary. It will remain there until the last Mass of the Easter season: the Sunday 5PM Mass on Pentecost Sunday. If nothing else it is a tangible reminder that these days are different from any others in the Church year as we recall His Resurrection.

Happy Easter and God Bless!

Appointments may also be made for a School Tour. Parents who are interested in registering their child for Pre-K or K will be required to bring their child to spend a day in the current class.



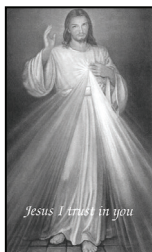
