| June 29 | Solemnity of Ss. Peter and Paul
Recalls the lives and subsequent martyrdom of the two great apostles, Peter to whom Jesus entrusted leadership of the Church and Paul, the great Apostle to the Gentiles. |
| Sept 14 | The Exaltation of the Holy Cross
Celebrates the great Victory of Jesus over sin and death that was obtained by His obedience and death on a Cross; there is no room for tears at this Victory Celebration. |
| Nov 2 | The Commemoration of the Faithful Departed
Gives us the opportunity to show our love for those who have ended their earthly journey and await the chance to behold the unveiled glory of the Living God. |
| Nov 9 | The Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome
Recalls the dedication of the first "official church" of Christendom as the Emperor Constantine gave one of his palaces as a fitting place for Christians to worship. |

I hope today and these other feasts to come throughout the year will help enhance your prayer life throughout the year. And as we have chance to meditate on the Divine Mysteries with saints and sinners alike we may be rewarded for all eternity.

PILGRIMAGE TO CATHOLIC FRANCE: Sept 28—Oct 9, 2014.



The trip will begin with a visit to Lourdes. There will also be the opportunity to pray before the incorrupt body of St. Bernadette at its final resting place in Nevers. Other stops will be the hamlet of Ars where St. John Vianney, read the hearts of his flock in confession; Paray le Monial – where St. Margaret received her vision of the Sacred Heart; and Lisieux where St. Therese, offered her "Little Way" for sanctity.

See ancient Roman ruins and Papal Palaces in Avignon, chateaux and ancient tapestries, famous cathedrals and inspiring monks, miracles of nature as the tides rise and fall around Mt St Michel, and miracles of man as we visit the Normandy beaches on which the Liberation of Europe began as well as praying at the US Cemetery there.

The trip will conclude in Paris, the "City of Lights;" touring the city by land and sea; praying the Miraculous Medal Novena in the chapel where Mary gave it St. Catherine. We'll be on the famous Champs Elysees as well as before the tomb of the faithful St. Vincent DePaul. Brochures are located by the church doors and at the rectory.
