FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

I was visited by a man from my first parish last week. He found me quite by accident. He was inquiring about our parish "Feast of Faith Series" he noticed in "The Tablet." He looked up our parish website (www.incrcc.org) for more info and saw John O'Connor was the pastor. He called to ask if I was the same one who was in his parish. When he got me on the phone he said: "Father O'Connor, I'm Robert Fasano from your first parish. Do you remember me?" I said: "Certainly. The landscaper, right?" Robert ended up attending the evening session about the Sacraments and we had the chance to chat a bit in my office before the class began. I was thrilled that he came out to Francis Lewis Blvd and he was equally thrilled that I remembered his name after close to fifteen years.

Names are part of who we are and also part of how we relate to each other. That is just a fact of life. We go by formal names and nick names. Some names are exclusive for families or for lovebirds. The Gospel today begins and ends with two important names for Jesus: *Lamb of God* and *Son of God*. Both give an insight into Jesus and His mission.

As I was thinking about my Brooklyn visitor. I was wondering how many of your names do I know? I think I know a good deal of them. But I still have a long way to go—over 1, 200 people attend Mass here each weekend. Sure I am getting older but I would love to know everyone's name here at Incarnation. Perhaps it is my advancing age, but could it also be that I don't know your name because you haven't come and introduced yourself? I stand in front of church after most Masses but oftentimes people don't linger to chat or say "Hi."

Four degrees might not be the best climate in which to chat. But I guess the question I can pose is: "Why wouldn't people want to be known?" Whether at hospitality or on pilgrimage, either after Mass or in the office I would love to greet you by name. It underlies an intimacy of friends and family.

As we kick off a new calendar year, perhaps 2014 will be the year I get to know your name. Maybe it will be the year that the Incarnation family grows stronger one name at a time; one person at a time. Maybe 2014 will be the year that you learn another parishioner's name.

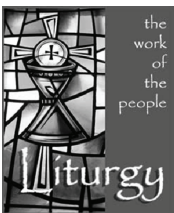
Holiday Closings. The school and parish office will be closed this Monday in observance of Dr. King's Holiday. Emergency sick calls will be returned promptly.

PILGRIMAGE TO CATHOLIC FRANCE: Sept 28—Oct 9, 2014.



The trip will begin with a visit to Lourdes. There will also be the opportunity to pray before the incorrupt body of St. Bernadette at its final resting place in Nevers. Other stops will be the hamlet of Ars where St. John Vianney, read the hearts of his flock in confession;

Paray le Monial – where St. Margaret received her vision of the Sacred Heart; and Lisieux where St. Therese, offered her "Little Way" for sanctity.

See ancient Roman ruins and Papal Palaces in Avignon, chateaux and ancient tapestries, famous cathedrals and inspiring monks, miracles of nature as the tides rise and fall around Mt St Michel, and miracles of man as we visit the Normandy beaches on which the Liberation of Europe began as well as praying at the US Cemetery there.

The trip will conclude in Paris, the "City of Lights;" touring the city by land and sea; praying the Miraculous Medal Novena in the chapel where Mary gave it St. Catherine. We'll be on the famous Champs Elysees as well as before the tomb of the faithful St. Vincent DePaul. Brochures are located by the church doors and at the rectory. 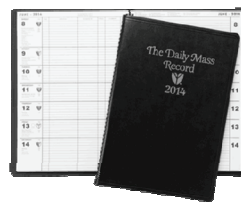
