FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

I think I found my first big beef with Pope Francis! No, it wasn't his recent Encyclical Letter on the "Care of our Common World." I can honestly say I wasn't scandalized when he challenged capitalism to look at the market economy "with a heart." No, what bothers me is that again he is not really taking a vacation. Sure, he is lightening up his summer schedule so there will be no public Mass each morning where he lives and he has curtailed some audiences. But once again he is not taking a summer rest.

Why does it bother me? In one sense I shouldn't care if the pope take vacation or not but in another way I feel short changed. How am I, or indeed all of us, short changed when the pope skips vacation? We are impoverished because he usually speaks about the theology of rest or the beauty of creation when he is off in the mountains or at his summer residence during the summer.

In the States, particularly, people undervalue vacation and rest it is integral to the human person and the bonds of family and friends. Here St. John Paul the Great reminds of the opportunities offered us when life slows down:

In the middle of summer, during our moments of physical rest and inner relaxation, we are offered an opportunity to pay greater attention to the needs of the spirit. Today I would like to emphasize in particular the importance of listening to the Word of God.

This, by revealing to us the horizons of the Lord's love, will not fail to enrich the holiday season with a particular note of spirituality, that will lead us then to live our regular activities with a renewed soul.

Sacred Scripture is in fact "a pure and lasting fount of spiritual life", and the "supreme rule of her faith" (cf. Dei Verbum, n. 21). It is like thirst-quenching water and food that nourishes the life of believers. I therefore invite everyone to cultivate a more intense and frequent contact with the Word of God, letting its healing and creative power work in us.

Perhaps life's frantic rhythm often prevents many people from taking up the Bible as they would wish. Why not make the most of the holidays to bring it with you and reflect on one or other of its immortal pages?
