Meet Father Chris Bethge

Rev. Christopher Jeffrey Bethge, 25, was born and raised in Sacred Heart parish, East Glendale, where he attended the parish school; Cathedral Prep Seminary, Elmhurst; Cathedral Seminary Residence, Douglaston; and St. Joseph Seminary, Yonkers. He holds a bachelor's degree in philosophy from St. John's University, Jamaica, and earned his master's degree in theology and master of divinity degree from St. Joseph Seminary. He received his bachelor of sacred theology degree from the Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas, Rome.

As a seminarian, he spent summers at St. Kevin, Flushing, and St. Sebastian, Woodside, where he was inspired by the faith and love of both the clergy and parishioners, and enjoyed ministering with the altar servers.

He served his diaconate year at St. Paul-St. Agnes, Cobble Hill, where he practiced his Spanish-language skills and preached in Spanish almost every weekend. Three Spanish-language immersion trips to Costa Rica with other seminarians rounded out his pastoral preparations.

When asked about discerning his vocation, he said: "It's really a call from Jesus, who is your best friend, someone whom you love. You want to do what He wants you to do with your life."

When Father Bethge offered his First Mass of thanksgiving at his home parish of Sacred Heart on Sunday, June 28 at 12:30 p.m., there will be six altar servers from Sacred Heart, St. Kevin and St. Sebastian parishes.—*from the Diocesan Press Release*
