## “WHERE DO YOU WANT US TO GO AND PREPARE FOR YOU TO EAT THE PASSOVER?”

### FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

Last weekend the Universal Church focused on the Mystery of the Blessed Trinity: Father, Son, Holy Spirit. This week we focus on how the Divine Mysteries come closer to us in the Sacred Body and Blood of Christ. As we celebrate *Corpus Christi*, the focus is not solely on the divinity of God—in French it's called: La Fete Dieu (God's Feast)—as much as the accessibility of God as present in the Holy Eucharist.

In the Holy Eucharist is the lasting Real Presence of Jesus Christ: Body and Blood, soul and divinity. That is why we genuflect on one knee when we enter a church or the two red lamps burn continuously on either side of the tabernacle in the sanctuary. But it is a Presence *for us* so that we can physically approach and be accompanied throughout the trials of life by Him whom the prophet Isaiah named: Emmanuel: God with us!

Corpus Christi Sunday, certainly, allows us to focus on the Divine Gift of Jesus in the Eucharistic Mysteries. But it also gives us pause to reflect on who we appreciate this Divine Gift of God Himself. Do I take advantage of the fact that in God's plan, God desires to remain with us until the end of the ages? How faithful am I in actively participating in Sunday Mass? When I enter a church building am I profoundly aware of the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist? Do I direct my thoughts, prayers and actions accordingly? Do I arrive at church before Mass or remain there after Mass to enjoy His Presence and deepen my communion with Him? Can I better avail myself to visits to Incarnation or other churches near where I work to spend time with Him who longs to be with me?

In the rich theology of the Church the words *Corpus Christi* (the Body of Christ) directs our thoughts to both the Eucharist—the Sacred Body and Blood of Christ whom we can receive in Holy Communion, and the Church Community—the Mystical Body of Christ of which St. Paul so often writes about when encouraging the infant Church Families entrusted to his care.

Ultimately, I think this Sunday simply reminds us how lucky we are to have the Real Presence of Jesus in our lives, and so accessible and close to us at that. To paraphrase a line from the Old Testament: What people are as fortunate as us to have a God so close to them as our God is to us!
