FROM THE PASTOR’S PEN

There are these three kids in the eighth grade that I always see together: Danny, Isaiah and Rey. They are always at the front of their class line each morning, they seem to wander the halls together, and all three assist the faculty at lunch time together. Now as inseparable as they seem, I know they don’t live together; they have other individual interests which do not include the other two. In a word they are “human.”

As we focus on the Holy Trinity this weekend, it is precisely the fact that Father, Son and Holy Spirit are Divine Persons in the Holy Trinity that make Them so beyond our understanding and appreciation. And yet, through Jesus, in the Incarnation, the Divine Mystery is closer and more tangible than first expected.

While the heavenly harmony of the Holy Trinity is unattainable for the created, Jesus gives us a blue print of how to live in community. By looking to the Community of the Trinity, the challenge for us is to reflect on and work towards making our own earthly communities better. Interdependence, obedience, sacrifice, fidelity, and charity all seem to work for Father, Son and Spirit. How about us? I think your world and mine would be better if we could more authentically mirror the Blessed Trinity.

Incarnation is one of the many communities to which we belong. We are concretely united with people in the pews as well as the Catholic Church Universal. How do you and I foster the relationships that come from this community? Do we even think about the Community of the Triune God when we reflect on the other relationships that we have?

During June everyone will have the chance to register in the parish and fill out a parish census card. This is just one of the ways that we demonstrate our connectedness together at Incarnation. I hope you will take the time to stop by one of the tables by the church doors to update or register here at the parish.

Just like Danny, Isaiah and Rey we can never be as united as the Holy Trinity. But one of the beauties of the Triune Mystery is that we are called to never stop trying to imitate our God.
