“RECEIVE THE HOLY SPIRIT!”

FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

I don't know about you but I love a good party. The food, music and setting is very important. But the people present is what makes or breaks the party for me! I want to gather with friends and family— people I know thoroughly. But I also like to meet their friends or new spouses, girlfriends and boyfriends. Without those new people the party might become routine and without some eccentric people, the party might become—dare I say it: boring!

As we gather for Pentecost and celebrate the “Birthday of the Church,” it's not too far of a stretch to say that the Church is like all those people at a gathering. As a matter of fact the English word “Church” comes from the Greek and Latin that mean “Assembly” or “Gathering.” Just think of it as all those invited to the gathering. Some you are related to. Some you know through others. Some you haven't met yet. And, yes, some are eccentric! We are joined to them, nevertheless, through our common Baptism and our desire to follow the person and preaching of Jesus Christ.

But who are these people? How do we look at them? Are they a threat? Can they be considered friend or foe? The fact that they are here at the gathering; the fact that they are here in the Church has me believing that I have a lot more in common with them than I first realize. We are children of the same Father. We are brothers and sisters to the same Jesus. We have common hopes, fears and goals for ourselves and our children. This feast of Pentecost reminds me that we breathe with the same Spirit that unites us all even in our individuality. I don't know everyone in the Church nor even in the parish. But I know why I am here and I can infer that others are here for the same reason.

If there is a feast in the Church Year that American Catholics should have a more keen understanding of, it should be Pentecost. The melting pot of America is only an image of the melting pot of the Church: the Great Gathering. The challenge for the Church and our parish is to tend to the others “at the party.” Reaching out to the new people, making them feel welcomed—as they rightly are—even enjoying the eccentricities in others that we all possess. It is then that we are most **The Church!**

On the day of Pentecost the many gifts of the faithful were only surpassed by the Gifts of the Holy Spirit. At Pentecost 2015 we are not just heirs to those gifts. We ourselves have many diverse and wonderful gifts that can be shared by the community and there are many diverse gifts of the community of which we can share.

Next time you come for Mass or a parish function look around and remember— “It's the people present that makes the party; it's the people present that makes the Church!”
