## FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

Sadly upon returning from my sabbatical I inevitably learned of people who died while I was away and returned to the Lord. Many, of course, were from Incarnation. A few left us way too early. Most, thankfully lived long and fruitful lives.

When I found out about the death of a woman from another parish who was very involved with the Church, I asked which priest said the Funeral Mass and did the homily. I was told there was no Mass of Christian Burial. You see, while this woman went to Mass every day back when I knew her, and was subsequently brought Holy Communion at her home when she could no longer get out, her family did not have a Funeral Mass for the repose of her soul. Now, I do not know if she ever had a conversation with her children about it, but I find it hard to imagine she would not want to have that Mass.

Unfortunately, this is not an isolated event in our post-Christian culture. As we remember the Dead in a special way this month of November we do so in a climate that all too often does not share our Faith and viewpoint. Sometimes members of our own families are tainted by the culture we live in.

As my father would say: “If you want something done right, you have to do it yourself!” That sentiment also ensures what rituals take place after one’s death. The best way to make sure you have a Mass of Christian Burial is to include those wishes in your pre-planned funeral arrangements. You can call all our local funeral homes for an appointment to sit with their staffs. While it might be uncomfortable for some, death is the reality of all. Even Jesus died and was buried before His Resurrection!

As we recall the Faithful Departed in a special way this time of year, you will find by the church doors information about *Catholic Teaching on Cremation* and *Catholic Cemeteries* that I hope you will take home.

**PILGRIMAGE TO CATHOLIC FRANCE.** Incarnation will be sponsoring a trip to France next Autumn. The trip will begin with a visit to Lourdes. There will also be the opportunity to pray before the incorrupt body of St. Bernadette at its final resting place in Nevers. Other Pilgrim stops will be the small village of Ars where St. John Vianney, Patron of Priests, read the hearts of his flock in confession; Paray le Monial – the city where St. Margaret received her vision of the Sacred Heart of Jesus; and of course Lisieux where St. Therese, the Little Flower offered her “Little Way” for sanctity.



There will be ancient Roman ruins and Papal Palaces in Avignon, chateaux and ancient tapestries, famous cathedrals and inspiring monks chanting, miracles of nature as the tides rise and fall around Mt St Michel, and miracles of man as we visit the Normandy beaches on which the Liberation of Europe began as well as praying at the US Cemetery there.

The trip will conclude in Paris, the “City of Lights:” touring the city by land and sea; praying the Miraculous Medal Novena in the chapel where Mary gave it St. Catherine.
