## FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

### “You Are God's Holy Ones!”

Very often in his letters you will hear St. Paul refer to the early Christians as “Holy Ones.” In fact the word used in Latin is “sancti” having the same root as our English word “saint.” For Paul sanctity comes from our union with, or our inclusion in, the Mystery of Christ Jesus. What is noteworthy, of course, is that Paul speaks about the living as the “Holy Ones” or “saints,” not the deceased. We use the term more in reference to the dead, in particular, the canonized Saints through the Church's history.

But Paul knew quite well that it was up to the living followers of Christ of his day to live and act heroically, thus helping form and assist future generations in their desire to be united to the Word Incarnate. As the saying goes we stand on the shoulders of those who have preceded us. Yet when we look to the canonized Saints through the years, they can almost become “petrified” as is the stone or wood from which we make their statues. We can almost forget that they were first human. They were very much just like us.

In recent years we have been very blessed as the modern age has allowed us to encounter “Holy Ones” who would later become canonized “saints.” We know them quite well: Sr. Therese of the Child Jesus and of the Holy Face, Mother Frances Xavier Cabrini, Padre Pio, Mother Teresa of Calcutta, Pope John XXIII or Pope John Paul II. First through photos and news reels, now with TV and video. Many of us have even had the opportunity to be in the presence of Pope John Paul II and Mother Teresa. How lucky we are.

I know that each is precious both in life and in death. They were many things to many people during their lives and the important thing is that they were flesh and blood: they were real! This All Saints' Day I challenge to look in the mirror and strive to see yourself as saint, as “God's Holy Ones.” You and I are called to leave behind those things that keep us, not from canonization, but keep us from union with Jesus.

Paul is right. We are God's Holy Ones. It's up to us to reflect God's Goodness in our actions today and to leave a better legacy for the Holy Ones who follow us in the years to come.
