FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

*Protect us, Lord, as we stay awake; watch over us as we sleep,
that awake, we may keep watch with Christ, and asleep, rest in his peace.*

With the return to *Standard Time* and the shortening of daylight it reminds me of the beauty of the night. I enjoy daylight like the next person but there is something special about nighttime. I first appreciated it when I was in the Navy. There is something peaceful and awe inspiring about the stars or the moon while you're sailing on the seas. During those hours the Navy has a long standing tradition of *Night Prayers*. Every vessel at sea pauses for prayer at 10PM (2200 hours for you nautical buffs).

The short non-sectarian prayer offered by the chaplain - no more than two minutes - is a way to thank God for the safety of the day, and to ask God's protection during the night. It was always moving to see how many of the young sailors and Marines would stop, close their eyes, oftentimes with a visible sigh of comfort and relief mindful that God was watching over them.

The Church also has *Night Prayers*, that are recited by the Sisters, Deacons and myself. They, too, thank God for the blessings of the day and ask protection through the night. But they also have a short examination of conscience to reflect on the day's actions. How can I be a better person tomorrow if I cannot remember what I need to improve on from today?

Perhaps growing up you prayed with your parents before bed. Maybe the comfort of mom and dad is better remembered than what was shared with God. Nevertheless, *Night Prayers* or *Bedtime Prayers* are a great opportunity to consciously share the closing day with God, both in thanksgiving and supplication.

So if you have fallen away from prayer at day's end, maybe the beautiful darkness is just the reminder you need. God Bless!

PILGRIMAGE TO CATHOLIC FRANCE. Incarnation will be sponsoring a trip to France next Autumn. The trip will begin with a visit to Lourdes. There will also be the opportunity to pray before the incorrupt body of St. Bernadette at its final resting place in Nevers. Other Pilgrim stops will be the small village of Ars where St. John Vianney, Patron of Priests, read the hearts of his flock in confession; Paray le Monial – the city where St. Margaret received her vision of the Sacred Heart of Jesus; and of course Lisieux where St. Therese, the Little Flower offered her “Little Way” for sanctity.



There will be ancient Roman ruins and Papal Palaces in Avignon, chateaux and ancient tapestries, famous cathedrals and inspiring monks chanting, miracles of nature as the tides rise and fall around Mt St Michel, and miracles of man as we visit the Normandy beaches on which the Liberation of Europe began as well as praying at the US Cemetery there.

The trip will conclude in Paris, the “City of Lights:” touring the city by land and sea; praying the Miraculous Medal Novena in the chapel where Mary gave it St. Catherine.
