FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

As we celebrated All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day this past week, I find that it heightens the awareness of those around us. Oftentimes the people around us are the ones that we most often take for granted. It's strange that for whatever reason the glory of God reflected by their actions is somehow dimmed.

Last weekend aspects of that radiance as it shines here at Incarnation was clearly recognized. On Friday evening at the Chapel of the Immaculate Conception over in Douglaston, Bishop Chappetto, received Rachid Murad and his classmates, into Candidacy for the Permanent Diaconate. These men from all over Brooklyn and Queens have taken the next step towards greater service to you and me in this Church of ours. Certainly they will have to study— usually at night during their evening classes but they will also be called to expanded ministry through the years leading up to Diaconate Ordination. Rachid is most recognized by those who attend the 9 or 10:30 Mass here at Incarnation as he frequently proclaims the Scripture passages for us.

On Sunday afternoon at St. Joseph's Co-Cathedral, Bishop DiMarzio bestowed Papal Honors on forty-nine faithful members of the diocese. Three of whom have a connection to Incarnation: Marie Fouche, Virginia Mampouya and Ricky Matela. The three were honored with an award that is given by the Pope to lay persons and clergy in recognition for the service that they have given to the Church conferring upon them the insignia of the venerable Cross, “Pro Ecclesia et Pontifice” – For the Church and the Pontiff.

Marie has been active in our parish and the Diocesan Haitian Apostolate for years. She has placed her gifts at the service of God and the Church. Most recently she is assisting Father Chris with Sunday School each weekend. Ginny, too, serves an ethnic Apostolate. In her case it is the Nigerian Apostolate. She also helps distribute Holy Communion at Mass here at the parish. She is also preparing to be on the Board of Directors for the school. Richard or Ricky Matela is not technically a parishioner of ours, yet he spends much time here. He places his wonderful musical abilities in the service of the Liturgy at Mass. He organizes and accompanies the music at our monthly Mass in Tagalong and at the First Friday evening Mass. I am moved and grateful for all three of them and I look forward to Rachid's ministry among us to expand.

Sometimes we are blind to others' gifts. Sometimes people hide or don't share their gifts. In Rachid, Marie, Ginny and Ricky not only are we blest but we all have a great example.
