FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

Although the school lost a portion of its roof (Don't worry. We found it Tuesday morning on one of the convent cars!), we were lucky enough to keep our power with the coming and going of *Sandy* last week. Thus I was able to watch a good amount of the storm coverage on the television. The two things that struck me were: the power of the storm and the heroics of the human spirit.

I think every time we are warned about a storm or a natural occurrence we almost collectively underestimate the power of nature. We, humanity, are top dog around here (or so Genesis tells us). With our intellect and free will we are the pinnacle of creation. But that does not mean there are not greater forces out there in nature: storms, fires, earthquakes and the like. How much more impressive then are the passages of Scripture that express the divinity of Jesus by relating to us that even the winds and storms are subject to Him. As well-loved creatures our power is limited by our human condition. All the more reason to genuflect before the power of the Creator of all things. We love to lift our voices singing “How Great, Thou Art,” I hope it also raises our awareness that we do not enjoy any equality with God but rather have a special place close to His heart.

The heroics of the human spirit, however, are much more in line with our earthly realm. And these heroics are magnificent and inspiring in their own right. This past week has demonstrated how we can take care of and watch out for each other selflessly even in the face of great personal danger. Sometimes because they get paid, or have special training, or do it so often and so well we can forget about the heroism of the first responders who protect us each day. This past week should remind us of those special men and women who put on uniforms or protective gear daily to keep us safe. But *Sandy's* clouds also allowed the light to shine on ordinary people who did ordinary and extraordinary things to help neighbors and strangers alike. Such great and imminent need somehow strips us of the things that might divide us. How wonderful it was to see the heroics of the human spirit not only overcome a storm but to do it collectively.

Perhaps part of *Sandy's* legacy will be for us a better understanding of not only the things we can't control but also the things that we can.

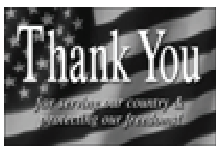
