FROM THE PASTOR’S PEN

As the Church observed “Respect Life Sunday” so it observes “Vocation Awareness Sunday” today. Next Sunday we will celebrate “World Mission Sunday.” These are all opportunities for reflection and prayer. Even with the growth of lay ministries in the Church, the Priesthood and Consecrated Life have a special place now more than ever. Certainly with the Priesthood is the Celebration of the Eucharist which sadly is becoming less and less frequent as there are less and less Priests and more and more Catholics throughout the world. But also those in Consecrated life offer not only tireless service for the Gospel but also by their very lives and vows point our thoughts to the Kingdom of Heaven. Are we aware of the importance of such vocations? Do we try to foster vocations to the Priesthood and Consecrated Life among our young people? Our culture has changed so much even since I was growing up in Brooklyn—we have to double our efforts.

He is a very concrete example of a young person who has recently said “yes” to God’s invitation. In his little time among us he has already made a great impact on our parish and school communities.

Let’s keep Vocations and the Missions in our thoughts and prayers so the Church will remain healthy in the future. Let’s try to leave the opportunity for future generations the opportunity the chance to hear and come to believe in Jesus Christ and the Gospel he has left us for our Salvation.

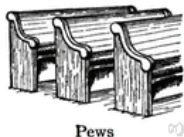

Securing an Annual *Living Light* Votive Candle to Honor a Loved One, Remember a Special Intention, or Mark a Milestone is a continual and wonderful way to celebrate sentiments and offer intercessions of remembrance, hope and gratitude. Two wall mounted electric candle stands now hang in our church on either side of the newly restored and expanded Saints' Shrine. These unique and inviting candles are made of real wax with electrified illumination to insure your *Living Light* burns brightly throughout the year. A plaque displaying the name of your loved one, your intention, or your milestone will be mounted before your *Living Light* Votive Candle. Plaques will remain for the year you have secured your *Living Light* and may be renewed or rededicated for additional 12 month periods. In addition to its rightful place before your *Living Light* in the Saints' Shrine, your Loved One, Special Intention, or Milestone will also be included in the *Living Light* Section of the Parish Website.
