FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

One of the highlights of the Parish Pilgrimage to Catholic France was the Little Flower. On her feast day, October 1st we recalled her intercession as the people of France looked to her for guidance. Then a few days later we visited her childhood home and the Carmel where she lived out her life. We had the opportunity to celebrate Mass in the great Romanesque Basilica erected in honor of St. Therese of Lisieux. It was simply a wonderful experience.

In addition to being Patroness of France St. Therese is also invoked as Patroness of the Missions. It might seem odd at first. She never left Europe and lived most of her days in the small northern French village. In fact a good deal of her time she was in the Carmel of Lisieux which is not much larger than our own convent on Francis Lewis Boulevard.

So how did this young saint become Patroness of the Missions? By prayer and desire! She longed to be a heroic missionary in her youth and when she realized that God was calling her to the solitude of the cloister she brought the missions to her. She prayed and sacrificed for the intentions of the Gospel, for those who preached it and for those who accepting the Gospel message might mean estrangement from their families or persecution from their neighbors.

It's true that St. Therese never made it to the missions but she wrote countless letters to French missionaries around the world reassuring them of God's favor on their undertakings and her personal prayers for the fruit of their works. It was her intense prayer that raised her up as a beacon for the missions even though she never left Lisieux or the Carmel.

Next week we observe Mission Sunday. Like little Therese we are called to be missionaries even if we won't leave Hollis or Queens Village. There will be a collection that will assist missionary endeavors around the world. Please be as generous as your means allow. But more importantly, be generous with your prayers. There are people and places still longing to hear the words of the Gospel and encounter the Lord Jesus. We can open our hearts to them. We can particularly remember those who are being persecuted for their acceptance of the Gospel.

This Mission Sunday let us all share the missionary zeal of the Little Flower of Lisieux.
