FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

It was announced early Monday morning that Pope Francis united with the Cardinals sitting in Ordinary Public Consistory in Rome have approved the causes for saintly canonization of Blessed John XIII and Blessed John Paul II. It is very fitting that this announcement is made as October dawns. The liturgical feasts of both of these revered popes fall in October: Blessed John XXIII on the 11th (the day he solemnly opened the Second Vatican Council in 1962) and Blessed John Paul II on the 16th (the day he was elected the successor of St. Peter in 1978).

This relatively long awaited announcement also comes as the Church prepares to closeout the *Year of Faith* next month. Fittingly both popes are intertwined with this observance even after their earthly lives have ended. The *Year of Faith* commemorates two historical events: The Fiftieth Anniversary of the Convocation of the *Second Vatican Council* and the Twenty-fifth Anniversary of the Promulgation of the *Catechism of the Catholic Church*. The first was called by Blessed John XXIII. The second was promulgated by Blessed John Paul II. The lasting impact of the actions of these two holy men will be explored for ages to come but the council and the catechism will be among their greatest gifts given to the Church.

At Incarnation we continue to explore these gifts to the church. As *The Year of Faith* winds down there will be a very special presentation entitled, *An Evening at the Council with George*, about the Second Vatican Council on Tuesday, October 29 by Msgr. George Ryan who was a seminarian in Rome during that privileged period of Church history. On the weekend prior—October 26-27—parishioners will also be given the chance to purchase their own paperback copy of the catechism at the main doors of the church for only \$10.

As we look to the canonization of these two Blesseds on April 27, 2014, it is very apparent they are “ours.” Good Pope John and John Paul the Great are part of our rich recent history in the Church. Included in that history was a council and catechism of teachings that remind us and all the world that the Church is alive! As alive and vibrant as the smile on John’s face or the twinkle in John Paul’s eye.

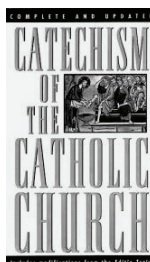


The **CATECHISM OF THE CATHOLIC CHURCH** will
