This week as we welcome our Holy Father to Washington, Philadelphia and, most especially, New York the crowds will be tremendous gathering in his presence. *The Shadow of Peter* in 2015 is not a shade cast but rather it is a voice heard, an example to imitate. This is why Pope Francis comes to us. This is why so many want to reach out to him. All those in his presence and all who encounter him in the media are in need of some aspect of healing as did the sick spoken about in the Acts of the Apostles.

So how will this 266th Peter help to heal us? How will Pope Francis make us well? I am sure that it will be through the Person of Jesus Christ. Without a doubt he will make the effort and take the time to reintroduce us to Jesus.
